WORD LIMIT

- The word limit is **3,000 words**, including footnotes, but not including your bibliography or the essay title/question.
- The word limit for this assessment must not be exceeded. Penalties for the word counts in excess of the published word limit are as follows:
 - 5 marks deducted immediately at the point that the word limit is exceeded.
 - 10 marks deducted where the word limit is exceeded by more than 10%.
 - In addition to the 10 marks penalty, any material in excess of 20% above the published word limit will not be read.
- Please note that misstatement of the correct length of your work may be treated as a disciplinary offence.

SUBMISSION

You must submit no later than the assignment deadline of 10am, **Monday 13th January 2020** in electronic form:

- Submit the electronic copy whilst logged in to the KLE in your own name. **Make a note of the Turnitin Paper ID** once the submission is complete (you can also find your Turnitin Paper ID in the automatic receipt sent by Turnitin to your Keele email).

Do not plagiarise from books or articles, or copy from each other.

- You may work together while studying for the assessments, but you must each write your essays independently. All work submitted will be submitted to computer analysis to help identify plagiarism and collusion.
- You must include a full bibliography and footnotes identifying where you are using ideas developed by others.
- Please note that the inappropriate use of a proofreader, as outlined in Section 5 of the University's proofreading guidance (<http://www.keele.ac.uk/studentacademicconduct/>) could be classed as academic misconduct.
